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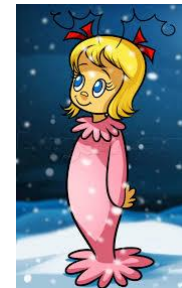

Review: Graduation Requirements

Total 20 credits

- English 4 credits (Eng 9, Eng 10, Eng 11, Elective)
 - Math 4 credits (must earn at least Alg II)
 - Science 3 credits (Bio, Physical Sci, Elective Science)
 - Social Studies 3 credits (World Hist., US History, Gov. & Econ.)
 - Physical Ed $\frac{1}{4}$ credit + $\frac{1}{4}$ credit **OR** PE Waiver*
 - Health 0.5 credit
 - Creative/
Performing Arts One full credit (Chorus, Band, Fine Art)
 - Electives At least 4 credits (Foreign Language, Business, Technology, Family/Consumer Science)
- *add 0.5 elective credit if utilizing PE Waiver

EOC- Ohio State Test

- Students need to earn 18 total points on the 7 EOC
- Math- minimum of 4 points

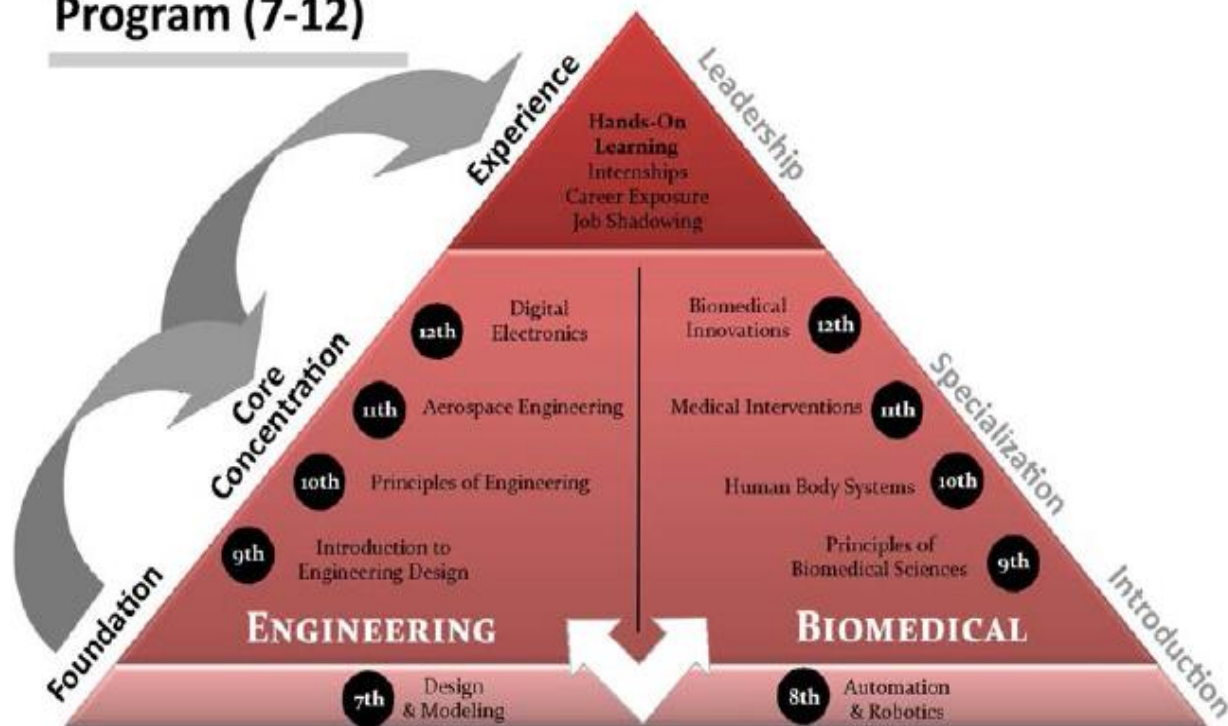

Athletes

- If you are participating in a Lakota West Sport you **MUST** have 5 solid classes:
 - ▣ Solid classes are any class other than PE.
 - ▣ Solid classes are semester classes earning .5 credit.
- Eligibility
 - ▣ **IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE, YOU MUST HAVE BEEN ENROLLED IN AND PASSED 5 SOLID CLASSES THE PRECEDING GRADING PERIOD AND BE PASSING 5 SOLID CLASSES DURING THE CURRENT QUARTER/ SEMESTER. IT IS ADVISED THAT YOU MAINTAIN 5 SOLID CLASSES THE ENTIRE ACADEMIC SCHOOL YEAR. SOLIDS ARE HALF CREDIT (.5) EARNING SEMESTER COURSES – ONE PE CLASS IS NOT CONSIDERED A SOLID.**
 - ****Talk to your guidance counselor for clarification.
 - ▣ It is advised to have 5 solids the entire school year (6 solids is preferred).
- NCAA eligibility center
 - ▣ If you anticipate participating in college sports you should be registering with the NCAA. ****Talk to your guidance counselor

How to register!

- All registration will be completed through the student's account in Home Access Center (HAC).
- Registration will begin **Jan. 30th – Feb. 8th**.
- Teachers will be making recommendation beginning **Jan. 18th**. Students should speak with their current teachers.
- You need to know your HAC log-in ID and password, please contact the guidance office.
- **If you do not select your classes, someone will select them for you. Signed verification sheet due by February 15th back to Guidance Office!**

- Select **Course Requests** from the menu
- Teacher Recommendations appear as **blue** hyperlinks above the Department. Teachers are making recommendations **Jan. 18th - 26th**.
- The recommendations may be kept or deleted.

Student and parent/guardian should read and understand the following factors in finalizing the requested schedule.

I UNDERSTAND THAT:

- If I am a college-bound student, I should carefully consider college admission requirements and college readiness in my course selection for next school year.
- If I am a high school athlete, I must have been enrolled in and passed 5 solid classes the preceding grading period and be passing 5 solid classes during the current quarter/semester of the sport. It is advised that you maintain 5 solid classes the entire academic school year. Solids are half credit (0.5) earning semester courses – one PE class is not considered a solid.
- If I am a potential collegiate athlete, I must meet the course, GPA and ACT/SAT eligibility requirements of the NCAA or the NAIA in order to participate in college athletics.
- I may drop a class during the first 10 days of the semester only. Dropping a class after 10 days have passed in the semester will result in a grade of W/F (withdraw/failing). The W/F will remain on my transcript and will be averaged into my GPA.
- I must meet 7 of the 8 criteria to earn a Diploma with Honors.
